Mary-Carson Stiff, Wetlands Watch: Q re: road elevation project: To achieve the 8 feet of SLR included in the newmarket creek study, the road would have been significantly elevated, as shown on the renderings. Was 8 feet impractical because you would have had to basically build a bridge?

Jonet Prevost-White: To Scott: Do you have concern about high bacterial levels in the SW Pond with the rookery? I there is a big one in Richmond that, while a nice amenity for the community (in a park, with seating, fishing, sidewalk), it's basically a big poop factory for the geese. Will it provide treatment for the potential increase in bacteria?

altan Erginkoc: Thank you Scott. Great presentation. What was the outreach issues during the project and how did you overcome?Do you mind share the PPT ?

Tom Brockenbrough - Accomack County: So on the policy increases they're giving us increases but some of these homes may have increases for multiple years since the percentage increase is capped. Is any information coming out on increases that will take multiple years to reach the full rate?

Tom Brockenbrough - Accomack County: and you just answered it

Danielle Spach, VB Office of Emergency Management: I have to jump off but I have no updates to add. Thank you for all of the information.

Harrison Lockard: I have to jump off early, no updates from our end. Thank you!

Matt Simons, Norfolk: Tom's question is extremely important to Norfolk as well. Norfolk is more interested in how the actualizations have changed (the full premium once the rate is no longer suppressed by the annual increase cap) rather than how the premium will change for the next renewal. This data would help us to plan and prepare for outreach and mitigation projects.

Tom Brockenbrough - Accomack County: Amending our ordinance to clarify freeboard and add the Coastal A construction requirements. Waiting to hear back from DCR on that draft. CRS Cycle visit in September, having monthly calls with Emily Schmidt. Thank you, Mary-Carson, for the issues we had with respect to the policy document on the RPA from ISO.

Kristin Owen - Henrico County: Jess, is ICAR limited to the Hampton Roads region, or can you work with communities in any coastal/tidal areas?
