From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: I think it's in the flood insurance manual

From Kristen Boyd: Why would a Pre-FIRM building be rated as Post-FIRM?

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: sometimes they can be rated as post-FIRM if they submit an elevation certificate for an actuarial rate. The flood insurance manual goes over a lot of the ratings as well, so it breaks down when they could be rated that way

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: I don't know

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: the flood insurance manual says they can use post-FIRM rates if more favorable, but the agent is supposed to submit for rate

From Kurt Luecke - Floodproofing.com : Homeowners can send in a new EC for review to our Risk Reduction Plus Group and not risk being charged more.

From Kristen Boyd: It would be good for the reporter to hear the presentations before he gets off.

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: Jay: with your review of the ECs, did you look at the values for lowest floor, next higher, mechanical, and flood vents?

From Mary-Carson Stiff: The NFIP/CRS program recommends a robust outreach campaign to the property owners to do their own due diligence. You can hold some of the hands that need the most help.

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: My understanding from talking to Rich about this, each property owner has to go to their agent to get any changes made (if needed)

From Kurt Luecke - Floodproofing.com : As a resource our Flood Risk Evaluation team has supported communities nationally by doing an audit of their negative rated policies and providing either one on one communication with the homeowner or a spreadsheet identifying issues and mitigation steps needed to correct

From Kristen Boyd: Chesapeake will draft a brief letter and list of questions. We can route it for input before sending to FEMA. An alternative might be a conference call with Rich.

From Mary-Carson Stiff: Thank you Kristen and Chesapeake team

From Tom Brockenbrough - Accomack County: Does the state mandated 1 foot of freeboard under the building code also apply to equipment?

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: I think so, but I'll double check. Unless one of the BOs on the call know off hand From George Homewood--Norfolk: As an FYI, there is a proposal to add to the freeboard requirement in the Virginia USBC...

From Mary-Carson Stiff: EC — New mandatory entry for Section 8, Property Information Item A4, Building Use (residential, commercial, etc.). If not filled out it will show as an error

From Bobby Cobelli - FEMA Region 3: Thank you, Mary

From Meg Pittenger, Portsmouth: I don't have anything to report.

From Kurt Luecke - Floodproofing.com: Thought....outreach could include guidance on how to determine if they have an issues and if so what mitigation steps are needed. Have to jump off....STAY SAFE out there!

From Kristin Owen - VA DCR: USBC R322.1.6 requires that mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems be elevated at or above the flood elevations required in R322.2/322.3, so freeboard would be required for these.

However, there is an exception that allows them to be below if they're protected in a certain way - this could be an issue but your floodplain ordinance requires that these are at least to the BFE

From Mary-Carson Stiff: Kristin - this 1 foot freeboard only applies to structures in the SFHA, correct?
